Reason for Test

- ABS = Absent from initial screening
- REF = Referral
- P.M. = Post-medical referral recheck
- RCK = Recheck of earlier test
- SPEC = Special Education (MDE, LD, ED, MDT, AEA Preschool)
- NEW = New Student

Results

- HWNL = Hearing within normal limits at this time
- N = Normal Hearing
- NES = Non-significant hearing loss
- PES = Potentially educationally significant hearing loss
- MR = Medical referral initiated
- ES = Educationally significant hearing loss

EDUCATIONAL CLASSIFICATION OF HEARING LOSS

- (N) Normal Hearing: Hearing is within normal limits for both ears at this time. This does not mean that this student could not acquire a hearing loss later in the school year or during subsequent school years.
- (NES) Non-Educationally Significant Hearing Loss. An NES loss describes a hearing loss which should not cause the student any significant problems in communication and/or classroom performance. If any problems are noted in association with the hearing loss, a referral for additional hearing services should be initiated.
- (PES) Potentially-Educationally Significant Hearing Loss: A PES loss describes a hearing loss which may vary in its severity and has the potential to significantly affect communication and/or classroom performance.
- (ES) Educationally-Significant Hearing Loss: An ES loss describes a hearing loss which has been demonstrated to cause significant problems in learning, communication, and/or social adjustment. Ordinarily, these problems are evident and require significant educational adjustments.
